GRAPHIC ARTS -YQS Grade 7 and 8 students will take Graphic Arts at Yellowquill School. Students will be getting the opportunity to work with ink, laser cutter, 3D printers, and various computer design programs. The chance to design and create items on computers allows students to work with technology in a variety of ways. Graphics will also be coordinating with Mr. McGowan at La Verendrye School in a metal project. Students have been busy making decals, 3D prints, keychains and multi-colored signs. INDUSTRIAL ARTS-METAL WORKS - LVS Grade 7 and 8 metal works class in our Applied Arts program is situated at LVS. Students will have lessons that prioritize the safe procedures in metal manufacturing processes using hand tools and machines, including automated cutting machines. Projects will allow all students to display creativity through the design process using manual and software based drafting skills. HOME ECONOMICS/CLOTHING AND TEXTILES-LVS In both grades 7 and 8, this program focuses on repair stitches using hand-sewing techniques, as well as creating useful projects on a sewing machine. While the grades 7s are introduced to the basics of these topics, the grades 8s leave the program having gained experience in using several stitches - including button repair - that will help them repair clothing and other sewn items while readying them for a Textiles option in high school. Students use a sewing machine to create textile projects while gaining a vocabulary of textile terms and experience in how to correctly and safely complete projects using a pattern. Grade 7s' first project is a tote bag, while the grade 8s' learn how to sew a zipper into a lined pencil case. I am looking forward to another exciting year! Mrs. Rhonda Hannah, LVS. 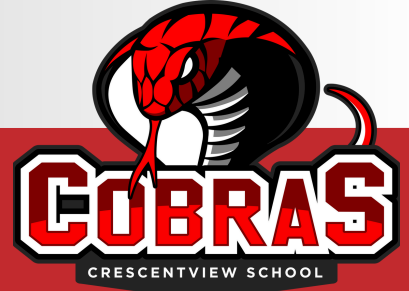
HOME ECONOMICS/NUTRITION-YQS Students will learn about nutrition, kitchen and food safety, equipment, and recipe knowledge. Students participate in hands on learning opportunities learning how to wash dishes properly, how to set a table, and how to measure ingredients correctly. Safety in the food lab is of the utmost importance and students are expected to follow all safety guidelines and hygiene expectations; hair up, closed toe shoes, and appropriate clothing in the food lab. During food labs, students observe and participate in a recipe demonstration and then work in teams in their own kitchen to complete the recipe together. Once complete students enjoy their efforts and sit together to eat and sample what they have made. Each food lab they rotate through kitchen jobs to experience all of the kitchen duties. Students can bring in any coins they would like for the next 3 weeks and place them in the Terry Fox money Jar in the office. Let's see if we can fill the jar!

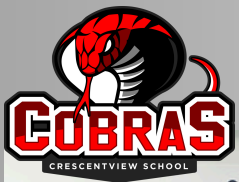
We are very proud to be associated with The Terry Fox Foundation and believe that our involvement will help launch a successful and meaningful school year.
