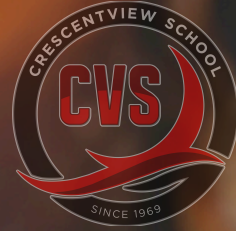

HEALTHY SCHOOLS INFORMATION

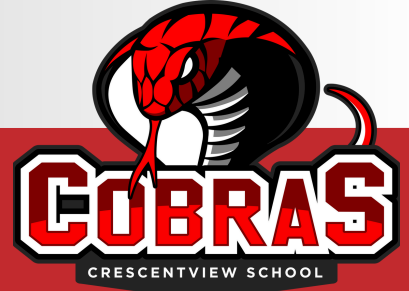

JUNIOR CURLING

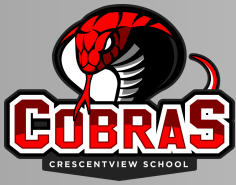
